## ***Fry Street Mural Finds A New Home***

The Greater Denton Arts Council is pleased to announce that the historic Fry Street Mural has a new home. Three portions of the original mural will be on permanent display on the Bell Street side of the Center for the Visual Arts. The dedication of the murals will be at 6:00 PM on Thursday, April 30. All interested parties are invited to come and celebrate the new home.

The Greater Denton Arts Council sponsored a poetry contest in conjunction with the mural unveiling. The winner will be announced by juror Alan Birkelbach. Alan is the 2005 Texas Poet Laureate. He was chosen to be juror because of his personal ties to Fry Street. Alan is a UNT graduate. The winning poetry will be read and Alan will share some of his writings, too. Denton poet Karla K. Morton will also share a poem about Fry Street.

These murals were originally commissioned by Denton resident Jim Smith, the former owner of Jim's Diner, which later became Bagheri's. They were painted in 1985 by Shawn Eichman. He wanted the diner to have an old-fashioned look. The work depicted a train with persons of note as passengers. The paintings were defaced during the tumultuous times when buildings were being torn down for new development. They were

restored by Jane Allison and David Ruffu, under the guidance of Carole Wilson. The mural sections obtained by the Greater Denton Arts Council portray Marilyn Monroe, John Wayne, the Beatles and the Beav.

The murals were removed from their original site by caring citizens. They are on cinderblock and were removed in 4 foot X 4 foot sections. They were first given to Habitat for Humanity for a fund raiser. Habitat generously offered them to the Greater Denton Arts Council. With the help of Little

Guy's Movers, the City of Denton and several dedicated persons they are now in their new location, secure and safe. Once again available for viewing to the citizens of Denton and visitors to our town.

The Greater Denton Arts Council is grateful to everyone who has made this possible.
